Announcement of Renewable Energy Initiative

Mechanicsburg, Pa. (September 17, 2007) – Race Miner, Keystone BioFuels, Inc. (Shiremanstown, PA) and the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners announced today that all Cumberland County Transportation Department buses will be fueled at John W. Gleim, Jr., Excavating (Mechanicsburg, PA) with petroleum and biodiesel fuel. This is the first time a Pennsylvania county has made the environmentally-friendly decision to fuel their transportation department’s vehicles with biodiesel. Dennis C Wolff, Secretary of Agriculture for the Commonwealth, also supported the announcement.

According to Race Miner, “Biodiesel is an environmentally friendly, renewable fuel. It can be used in any application where conventional diesel fuel or heating oil is used.” He added, “I am proud to be a part of Cumberland County’s support of the renewable energy industry.”
